## PERSONALITIES

**Bill Brewer (DIRECTOR):** Bill is an OxACT co-founder, and has directed close to 100 productions, many of those for OxACT. Last summer he directed *State Fair* for Miami University Summer Theatre and will direct the upcoming *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat* for MUST. He has acted professionally throughout the Midwest and most recently received a City Beat nomination for his portrayal of John/James in *Love, Valour, Compassion*. Bill teaches in the Speech Com and Business School at Miami and owns his own consulting company. He also serves on the City of Oxford Planning Commission. In his limited spare time, he enjoys his dogs, playing bridge, and reading.

**Marcia Olcott (MUSICAL DIRECTION):** Marcia has been involved with many OxACT musicals since the early '80s, most recently having provided keyboard accompaniment and/or musical direction for *Dames at Sea* and *Nun-crackers*. Her other theatre credits include performing with Miami theatre, MUST, Greater Hamilton Civic Theatre, Middletown Lyric Theatre, and Footlighters. Her day job is as the Administrative Assistant in Miami's Department of Architecture and Interior Design. She is the wife of James Olcott, professor of music at Miami, and the mother of sons Evan and Ryan, who are both musicians in Minneapolis.

**Meggan Peters (AGNES):** Meggan has had numerous roles in OxACT musicals, most recently appearing as Sister Robert Anne in *Nun-crackers*. She has also created costumes for several OxACT productions. She also performs regularly in local dinner theatres, and appeared last year as Melissa Frake in the MUST production of *State Fair*. She is a featured vocalist with the Cecil Young Orchestra, PM Big Band, and the P&G Big Band, as well as a member of the *Steppin' Out* vocal quartet. Her day job is as the Costume Shop Supervisor for the Miami Department of Theatre. Meggan would like to thank Marcia, Bill, and Chris for "showing me the funny side of this subject," and "Jake and Nathan for showing me the funny side of everything else, and for being living proof that good things can come in dysfunctional packages."

**Chris Witt (MICHAEL):** Chris has also performed in many OxACT productions, including *Baby, Closer than Ever, Music Man, The Fantastiks, Once Upon a Mattress*, and, most recently, *Nun-crackers*. He has also been seen in the Hamilton Civic Theatre productions of *Into the Woods, Pump Boys and Dinettes*, and *Is There Life After High School?* In addition, he is a member of the vocal quartet *Steppin' Out*. His other job is as the Catering Manager for DiPaolo's restaurant. Chris is very happy to be combining forces with OxACT veterans and friends Bill Brewer, Meggan Peters, and Marcia Olcott to do this show. *McCullough-Hyde Memorial Hospital, founded in 1957, is a non-profit general medical/surgical acute care hospital. The medical staff includes more than 80 Board certified physicians representing 30 specialty areas. Among services provided are emergency and urgent care, intensive care, imaging, physical therapy and rehabilitation, respiratory care, adult and pediatric inpatient and outpatient services, obstetric and nursery unit, general and same-day surgery, laboratory services, sleep disorder center, women's health services, specialty physician clinics, and volunteer services.*

*McCullough-Hyde is currently undergoing a major expansion, with completion expected in the fall of 2003. The expansion will increase the hospital by 53,000 square feet, and includes renovation of 23,000 square feet of the existing facility. The project will add 32 private medical, surgical and pediatric patient rooms, expanded ambulatory surgery and outpatient treatment space, and expansion of the Imaging Services department.*

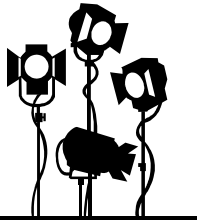

## A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

The third time is a charm. This marks my third production of I Do! I Do! in the past 25 years. Granted, the first two times I played Michael I was, somewhat, younger. But when OxACT asked me to return and direct again, I could not resist. In the close to 200 productions I have been involved in during my years in theatre, this is one of the few shows that I have done more than once.

Why? Because I like what it says about life. Relationships come in all shapes, sizes, denominations--you name it. And today, that is truer than it was fifty years ago. But relationships all have one theme in common--they are never, ever easy. You have to work on them everyday and even that is no guarantee for success and longevity.

Some might say that Michael and Agnes have become a romantic notion of what marriages and relationships used to be. I just don't buy that. Michael and Agnes are a testament to loving, forgiving, accepting, and embracing our own and our spouses strengths and shortcomings. If we can do that and withstand the pressures of a contemporary society, we might all have the peace and serenity that Michael and Agnes have when they realize that "marriage is a very good thing, though it's far from easy. Still it's filled this house with life and love."
